2021 Refund / Cancellation Policies

1. **All camp fees must be paid in full by June 1st, 2021.**
 - a. Camp Seneca Lake reserves the right to cancel registrations with unpaid balances.
2. **Prior to March 15th, 2021, all camp fees are fully refundable.**
 - a. Please review this document, the family handbook and the COVID-19 operating playbook in its entirety. We recognize the element of uncertainty for this summer; however, we feel confident we can safely operate. If you have determined for any reason that you would like to withdraw your camper's application, you may request one of the following:
 - i. Please consider donating all or part of your 2021 Camp deposit. Your gift is automatically doubled by the Harold Grinspoon Foundation's All Together Now: A Matching Grant for Jewish Camps.
 - ii. Apply your current 2021 deposit towards the 2022 Camp Seneca Lake season enrollment deposit.
 - iii. Receive a refund.
3. **After March 15th, 2021, all deposits for each camper and each session become non-refundable.**
 - a. Including if New York State and or Yates County determines that we cannot open and operate CSL this summer.
 - b. Your deposit covers the cost of opening camp, a process that begins in September of the previous year.
4. **If a camper tests positive for COVID-19 and/or is unable for documented medical reasons / forces of nature to be admitted to camp on Opening Day, all fees will be refundable less the non-refundable deposit.**
5. **Any camper that sustains injury or illness while at camp resulting in departure from campus, will have pro-rated fees refunded less the non-refundable deposit.**
6. **There are no deductions for a camper/family that chooses to leave Camp early.**
 - a. For example, i.e., sports try-outs, family vacation, etc.
7. **The Camp Director(s) reserve the right to dismiss any camper without refund who; willfully disregards camp rules or endangers the safety of themselves or others. Physically, psychologically, or verbally abuses another member of the camp community, destroys camp property or the property of another person while at camp, requires greater supervision than can reasonably be provided by camp staff, possesses or consumes alcohol or illegal drugs at camp, or breaks any other rules/policies as dictated in the Code of Conduct, Family Handbook and the COVID-19 Playbook.**
